Ensures funds will be used for larger capital expenditures with Town Meeting authorization




Aligns with recommendations from Capital Improvement Plan

Transfer out of Ed Stabilization to cover difference



Vocational ed budget increase of ~\$75k due to new enrollments + rate increases

Increased assessments from Hampden Co retirement + Hilltown ambulance



Savings from Treasurer-Collector transition - Implements wage/salary recommendations







\$1.56M in non-Enterprise Fund stabilization accounts







Small debt issue: \$600k @ 4% over next 10 years



Covers replacement of brush truck and Engine 1



Uses debt as a tool to allow flexibility for Dept. in vehicle replacement

Fire Equipment Issues




Engine 1 – 1996

- Issues:
 - Pump failed annual testing
 - o Broken ladder brackets
 - Real warning lights
 - Oversized brackets for Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus
 - Repair costs averaging \$15,000 annually

Brush 3 - Loaned from Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) in the 1970s

- Issues:
 - Challenges with starting pump
 - Inadequate hose reel and minimal water supply
 - Unable to tow utility
 - Failing backpack water pumps

\$15,000 from Library Building Stabilization







Transfer Retained Earnings for debt, stabilization and capital



Transfer Retained Earnings for capital and current year utility bills



Water budget anticipates SCADA project



Articles 27-29: Bylaw Updates





Allows Town Clerk to make ministerial corrections as needed



Creates Commission on Disability



Reduces bond requirement for hauling on Town roads above 10 tons
